MEETING OF THE MINDS Workforce Conference Focuses on Turning Uncertainty into Opportunity

SMART staff from all four service counties participated in this year's California Workforce Association Meeting of the Minds conference, themed "Fearless Forward: Turning Uncertainty into Opportunity." The event brought together workforce leaders from across the state to explore strategies in business-led innovation, trauma-informed programming, data-driven decision making, and emerging technologies like AI and VR in training. By engaging in these conversations, SMART staff strengthened connections and brought back fresh ideas to enhance services and outcomes in the communities we serve.



In addition to innovation and technology, this year's conference emphasized collaboration and adaptability as key drivers of workforce success. Sessions highlighted the importance of cross-sector partnerships, aligning

education and industry needs, and creating inclusive pathways for populations often left behind in economic transitions. SMART staff had the opportunity to hear directly from state and national leaders on policy trends shaping the future of work, from climate-resilient job sectors to equitable access to digital skills. The conference reinforced the value of continuous learning and proactive leadership, inspiring

Disaster Response Grants make BIG Impact in Trinity County



Through the National Dislocated Worker Grant (NDWG), SMART launched cleanup and repair projects in Del Norte County in May 2023 and in Trinity County in October 2023, offering temporary employment to individuals impacted by the severe winter storms.

Originally designed to employ 44 people, the program far exceeded expectations, ultimately placing 68 individuals into jobs focused on repairing storm-damaged public lands, public structures and recreation and trail systems—52 in Del Norte County and 16 in Trinity County.

The grant officially ended on June 30, 2025, closing out a two-year initiative that helped transform storm damage into an opportunity for growth and community renewal.

Through these NDWG grants, SMART has strengthened partnerships with community partners such as the U.S. Forest Service, the County of Del Norte, and the Watershed Research and Training Center to continue providing training and employment opportunities for individuals enrolled in other SMART grant-funded programs—ultimately improving the local labor market and the communities we serve.

Kyle's Journey Towards Stability and a Fresh Start

When Kyle first came to the SMART Workforce Center, he was facing multiple challenges. Recently released from incarceration, he was referred by Probation and in need of job search assistance and stability. Homeless but determined to change his circumstances, Kyle brought with him a strong work history and he was open to any opportunity that could help him get back on his feet.

With guidance from SMART staff, Kyle worked on building a new résumé and preparing for interviews. His dedication paid off when he was selected for a temporary position as a Facilities Maintenance Worker Assistant through SMART's Transitional Jobs program.

SMART provided supportive services throughout Kyle's employment journey — including assistance with work attire, rental support, and ongoing coaching. His supervisor consistently noted that Kyle arrived on time, worked hard, and contributed positively to the team.

After completing his transitional job, Kyle shifted his focus back to job searching. With SMART's continued support, he updated his résumé, developed a job search action plan, and applied for a Cook position at a nonprofit— a role that connects directly with his prior experience and desire to give back. Recognizing his need for transportation and weather protection, SMART also helped Kyle purchase a bike and rain gear to ensure he could commute safely and attend interviews, regardless of the weather.

Today, Kyle continues to build momentum toward stable employment and housing. His story reflects perseverance, accountability, and the powerful impact of a supportive community network. Through partnership and persistence, Kyle is turning his second chance into a solid foundation for success.
